EDBERG TO CHALLENGE RIOS

Swedish ace Stefan Edberg vows to defeat reigning champion Marcelo Rios

Tennis enthusiasts and those looking for an extra special day out will welcome the news that the annual Vale do Lobo Grand Champions Caixa Geral de Depósitos tennis tournament is set to return to the resort between 11th and 14th August, briging with it some of the hottest names from the veteran circuit.

Following the tournament's official press conference held both at Lisbon and at Vale do Lobo on 16th July, eight players of diverse nationalities and impressive track records have now been announced. In addition to last year's champion, Chilean Marcelo Rios, whose presence had been confirmed

earlier in the year along with that of Swedish ace Stefan Edberg - appearing for the first time at the Vale do Lobo Tennis Academy – the tournament will include the star-studded line-up of fellow Swede Mats Wilander, enigmatic Frenchman Henri Leconte, Brazil's Fernando Meligeni, Greg Rusedski from the United Kingdom, German star Marc Goeliner and Portugal's Nuno Marques.

The Grand Champions tournament is widely regarded as an important event on the Senior Tour calendar, and now in its 9th year, continues to attract a wide audience year after year, which is echoed by the large number of television channels

who choose to broadcast the matches to millions of viewers in all corners of the world. It is now the largest sports event to take place in Portugal at this time of the year, helping to raise the profile not only of the resort but of the entire Algarve region. As in previous years, it promises some truly momentous play from some of the finest players in history, only with a more recreational and convivial atmosphere, as the players - often relaxed - joke and involve the audience, making it an excellent option for the entire family.

As in previous years, tickets for the Vale do Lobo Grand Champions Caixa Geral de Depósitos tournament sell quicker than

they can be printed so be sure to reserve yours without delay. Tickets are still available and range from 17 Euros to 50 Euros per day with a special four day pass offering an attractive discount. RECOVERY TIME FOR DAVID JAMES

Vale do Lobo provides the perfect retreat for rehabilitation

England goalkeeper David James recently chose a rehabilitation programme at Vale do Lobo, organised by physiotherapist John Green, also attended by Kieron Dyer of West Ham, Craig Bellamy of Manchester City and Coventry's Leon McKenzie.

"Having been here with the England team and had such a great time I was obviously very interested in coming out to the resort again when John suggested the rehabilitation work. It's just a brilliant place to relax - we've been taking a leisurely stroll to the Praça for breakfast and the kids love it down there. People are always helpful and friendly, which we like, and facilities are first class."

The star, whose career includes spells at Aston Villa, Liverpool and West Ham, now plays for

Portsmouth and is a popular player on the England team, holding a Premier League record of 536 appearances - since overtaking Gary Speed's 535 - having also been capped by England 48 times.

A long-standing injury to his shoulder and subsequent operation in June made him miss World Cup qualifiers, but he is certain that the timing of the operation will ensure that he is fit to play in the World Cup 2010 games, and he remains the team's first choice for goalkeeper. "I'm feeling fitter by the day and have been working on strict rehabilitation so that I can be fully prepared for the games ahead. It's a very exciting time now for all of us in the build up to the World Cup. We have a strong team and are all very con-



fident that we will do England proud. For me, training here has been perfect - to be able to use the beach has been really instrumental in recovering strength in my knee, which has also been injured, as the surface is not too hard for running - whilst the football pitch has also been great for us to work on various exercises.'

Vale do Lobo wishes David James a speedy recovery.
